- Jeremy was an industrial and commercial journeyman electrician
- He was paralyzed at T5/T6 following a motorcycle accident
- Received an exterior ramp, hard surface flooring, door widening, shower chair and bath remodel including a roll in shower

Donal Edwards of Fortville, Indiana

- Donal was in charge of mechanical, electrical and plumbing operations for the Indianapolis area YMCA
- Donal was paralyzed at C7 after fall while installing a rooftop HVAC system
- Received assistive technology allowing him to control computer, television, lighting, ceiling fans, video intercom, motorized door openers and HVAC thermostat settings at home

Brett Rhodes of Dublin, Georgia

- Brett owned an HVAC contracting business
- Brett suffered paralysis & traumatic brain injury after falling off the roof while working on rooftop HVAC equipment
- Received wheelchair lift and driving controls for Brett's truck

Frank Holub of Schenectady, New York

- Frank was employed as a residential/commercial/industrial painting contractor
- Frank has idiopathic pulmonary fibrosis & a seriously disabled daughter
- Foundation teamed with Lennox to provide new furnace & high efficiency air cleaner along with making payment on wheelchair accessible van for daughter
